NOTICE OF RACE

1. ORGANISING AUTHORITY

1.1 The organising authority is the Royal Solent Yacht Club.

2. RULES

2.1 The races will be governed by the current World Sailing Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) including the prescriptions of the Royal Yachting Association, the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions and any relevant class rules.

3. ELIGIBILITY

3.1 Boats shall not be deemed to be racing unless the owner or person in charge has completed the online Dinghy Week entry form together with the required fee for this event to the RSYC Sailing Secretary.

- 3.2 Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Race Committee.
- 3.3 All competitors under the age of 18 on 5th August 2024 must ensure that their entry form and parental consent form is signed by a parent or guardian.

4. FEES

4.1 Early Bird Entry Fee of £40.00 for four days racing available til midnight 15th July; Standard Entry Fee of £60.00 is from 16th July onwards; Daily Entry Fee is £20.00.

5. CLASSES

- 5.1 Classes will include:
 - Pico (trainer sail)
 - Pico (race sail)
 - ILCA 4 (formerly Laser 4.7)
 - ILCA 6 (formerly Laser Radial)
 - ILCA 7 (formerly Laser Full Rig)
 - •18+ Laser
 - Scow
- 5.2 Classes may be combined at the discretion of the Race Committee.
- 5.3 There must be at least three entries in order to run a class.

6. SCHEDULE

- 6.1 Registration is from 0900 on Monday 5th August at the RSYC.
- 6.2 Briefing to all competitors & parents is 1000 on Monday 5th August, RSYC lawn.
- 6.3 There will be two races run back to back each day; at the discretion of the Race Officers, additional races may be run. Competitors will need to check with the PRO
- 6.4 The scheduled time of the first warning signal will not be before 1100.

7. RACING AREA

7.1 Racing will be in the area of the Western Solent and/or Bouldnor Bay.

8. PROTESTS

8.1 The Exoneration Penalty and the Advisory Hearing and RYA Arbitration of the RYA Rules Disputes Procedures will be available.

9. SCORING

- 9.1 The low point scoring system of RRS Appendix A will apply.
- 9.2 In each class, 2 races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

10. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

10.1 The Sailing Instructions will be available at RSYC or to download from www.royalsolent.org from 30th July 2024.

11. PRIZES

- 11.1 Trophies will be awarded to the overall winner in each class for the Regatta:
 - Pico (trainer sail)
 - Pico (race sail)
 - ILCA 4 (formerly 4.7)
 - ILCA 6 (formerly Laser radial)
 - ILCA 7 (formerly Laser standard)
 - Scow
 - Best Under 14 (Michael Ball trophy)
 - Best Under 16 Laser Radial or 4.7 (silver tankard)
- **12**. The Prize Giving will be on Thursday 8th August on the lawn of the RSYC as soon as possible after racing.

13. RISK STATEMENT

- 13.1 Rule 3 of RRS states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone." Sailing is by nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor or if a junior its parent or guardian, agrees and acknowledges that;
 - (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk while taking part in the event;
 - (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
 - (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
 - (d) The boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;

- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the race organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- (g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to the venue, in particular Yarmouth Pier, and the outhaul off the end of the RSYC jetty.
- (h) It is also their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to the event which are drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the event, and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

14. INSPECTION:

14.1 The fact that race officials may carry out inspections of a boat does not reduce the responsibilities of each competitor to ensure compliance with the above.

15. INSURANCE

15.2 All boats are required to hold adequate insurance and in particular to hold insurance against third party claims including cover for racing in the sum of at least £5,000,000 (FIVE million pounds sterling). By entering, entrants declare that such cover will be maintained in full force throughout the Regatta and agree to allow the RSYC, at its discretion, to pass on their contact details to third party insurers in the event of a possible insurance claim.

16. BOAT HANDLING ABILITY

16.1 **All competitors** must be capable of launching and recovering their boats as sea conditions at the RSYC slipway can be demanding. This is a SAFETY MATTER and ALL COMPETITORS are solely responsible for this activity. Launching and recovery teams are at hand but cannot guarentee to be always available at busy times. Parents are required to assist with this SAFETY task
